One of our pupils, Charlie, was diagnosed with a grade 2 oligioastrocytoma brain tumour at just eight months old. He is now 10 years old and has been battling it ever since. He has had two major brain surgeries and three different chemotherapy and immunotherapy treatments to fight the tumour. TeamCharlie (a team of family and friends who take part in events/challenges) took on the Thames Path Challenge and walked 100km in just two days to raise money for three charities - Brain Tumour Research, The Royal Marsden Hospital Children's Unit & The Magical Taxi Tours.

TeamCharlie spent a total of 23 hours walking from Henley-on-Thames to reach their destination, Wandsworth Park in Putney. Charlie and his brother, Freddie, joined in for the last 1km to keep everybody going - it made such a difference to know that he was with them. They pushed themselves to their limits, emotionally and physically. There was blood, sweat and tears, literally! A few first aid incidents, ripped tendons, pulled muscles and Charlie's Mum, Kirsty lost count of how many blisters she saw on everyone's feet! But the effort was unbelievable and it resulted in an amazing achievement \heartsuit W W So proud of them all. So far the team have raised just over £13,000 from this walk alone!




Spotlight on Y6 – Science

This week, 6RB conducted an investigation into how the number of cells within a circuit would have an effect on the brightness of a light bulb. The children independently constructed circuits including switches and were able to talk about the impacts of variables such as the increase/decrease in voltage and the effect this had on their outcomes. Here they are in action- certainly some electricians in the making!











Safeguarding – Squid Game on Netflix!

Squid Game is a television show on Netflix that is about a group of vulnerable adults who have a chance to win money through a set of tasks. This is currently the most watched show in 90 countries and nearly all episodes of



the '15' rated show contain violent and gruesome scenes. This means the content has been viewed as too graphic for younger children.

Due to the popularity of the show and its challenge-based themes, Squid Game has become popular on social media platforms. This includes people recreating the games and acting out scenes from the TV show. We have been made aware that some children have been mimicking Squid Game in the playground.

Scary stuff in the media often creates a sense of alarm which can become selffulfilling. Although it seems counter-intuitive, it is usually best not to name the frightening content.
